





Now, I'm the leader of a peer group at school that works with other students on conflict resolution and de-escalation tactics.

### Angelo • WASHINGTON, DC

I faced some challenges in my life that made it hard for me to control my temper. But I found a caring adult in my school who saw beyond my anger to the smart, funny person I really am. He helped me recognize the power of positive interaction and the impact of making other people smile and laugh. Now I'm more outgoing, and I hope to become either an NBA player or a mechanical engineer.

My family and I lost everything to Hurricane Harvey my junior year of high school. I struggled with the stress of displacement and the pressure of being strong for my family. Finding a community of support at my new school made all the difference in recovering from the hurricane.
